Local water done well

Discussions are ongoing around the future of local water services across New Zealand


Councils are preparing to make decisions relating to the development of a water services delivery plan that will meet Government requirements for delivery of safe and financially sustainable water services, while considering the environment and regulatory requirements. The water services delivery plans will describe how councils intend to deliver the three water services (freshwater, wastewater, stormwater) and which other councils they might join up with (if any) to do this.

Masterton District Council (MDC) joined our neighbouring Wairarapa Councils and seven other councils in the Wellington region to do some early work to understand what a Regional Water Services Delivery model (across the 10 councils)

would look like. MDC is due to decide on whether it continues as part of the Wellington Regional model in November

That decision will tie the Council to the future Wellington regional model if it decides to remain involved. If not, then it will still have other options to consider. One of those options relates to a smaller Provincial Delivery model involving the Wairarapa and Tararua district councils. A team was set up a few months ago to evaluate this option and bring back their findings to the Council to help them with the decision.

Options for water service delivery models, including retaining our current approach, will go out for public consultation in early 2025. Meanwhile, for the latest information on where we're at, head to our website and search 'local water done well'.



Coastal alcohol bans

Alcohol bans are again in place for Riversdale and Castlepoint for Labour Weekend.

The ban on carrying or consuming alcohol in public will run from 7pm-7am on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights, 25-28 October.

The following areas are covered by the bans:

Riversdale - Orui Station/Riversdale Road intersection, and along Riversdale Road to Riversdale township, Bodle Drive to the lagoon and including Riversdale Beach, from the lagoon to the Southern Riversdale Reserve to the water's edge. From Blue Pacific Parade and Bodle Drive intersection along Blue Pacific Parade to and including the Southern Riversdale Reserve, including the beach to the water's edge

From Riversdale Road and Pinedale Crescent intersection along Pinedale Crescent to the intersection with Blue Pacific Parade. The southern terrace off Palm Parade and the middle terrace off Pinedale Crescent, being Rochdale Road, Otaraia Road, Bull Lane, Tama Road, Pukeko Place and Knoyle Road.

This includes all public places, public parks and

accessways into the defined area where the prohibition will be extended to

Castlepoint - From the Castlepoint motorcamp to the Castlepoint lagoon, including Jetty Road and Castlepoint Beach, to the water's edge. From in front of the motorcamp to the Castlepoint lagoon. including Castlepoint Reserve. Also including Guthrie and Balfour Crescents and all public roads and places to which the public have access within the township of Castlepoint

The usual New Year's Eve ban on alcohol vehicles at Riversdale and Castlepoint on will also again be in place

To ensure everyone has a great time at the beach over New Year, road closures and alcohol-free zones will again be in place at both Castlepoint and Riversdale

Alcohol-free zones: 6pm, Monday 30 December 2023 until 6am, Wednesday 1 January 2024

Road closures: 4pm, Tuesday 31 December 2023 until 6am, Wednesday 1 January 2024
